QUESTION #1

Are you willing to consider RFP's that would partially comply with the overall specifications of the project, or are you looking for only an all-in-one solution?

RESPONSE

We are willing to consider responses that meet all of the requirements designated as mandatory in the RFP, without meeting the desirable requirements. However, SFUSD is not willing to consider solutions that cannot meet the mandatory requirements for each area of functionality specified in the RFP.

QUESTION #2

What Student Information System do you currently use?

QUESTION #3

RESPONSE

SFUSD is seeking an integrated solution for email, webhosting, and the classroom portal (gradebook, assignments) functionality outlined in the RFP.
